The Real Meaning of ADVENT

1st Sunday of Advent

First Sunday in Advent the "Candle of Hope" or "Expectation" is lighted, Scripture is read, a devotional may be given, and prayer is offered. We have hope because God is faithful and will keep promises made to us. Our Hope comes from God.
Romans 15:12-13

2nd Sunday of Advent

Second Sunday of Advent the "Candle of Love" or "Candle of Peace" or the "Candle of Preparation" is lighted, Scriptures is read, a devotional may be given, and prayer is offered. Preparation means to 'get ready'. Help us to be ready to welcome You, O God!

Luke 3:4-6

Note: *Prepare or get ready for the Christ Child, coming the first time as Emmanuel

"God with Us", while looking forward and prepare or get ready for the 2nd coming when Jesus Christ returns to set up His Kingdom."

3rd Sunday of Advent

Third Sunday of Advent or Rose or Pink "Candle of Joy" is lighted, Scripture is read, a devotional may be given, and prayer is offered. The Angels sang a message of Joy.

Luke 2:7-15

4th Sunday of Advent

Fourth Sunday of Advent the "Candle of Peace" or in other traditions the "Candle of Love" is lighted, Scripture is read, a devotional may be given, and prayer is offered. God sent His only Son to earth to save us, because God loves us!

John 3:16-17

<u>Christmas Eve (after sundown) or Christmas</u> Day

On Christmas Eve or Christmas Day the central white "Christ Candle" is lighted, Scripture is read, a devotional may be given, and prayer is offered. The white candle reminds us that Jesus is the sinless, spotless Lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins! His birth was for His death; His death was for our birth.

On Thanksgiving Day 2014, we served a traditional Thanksgiving meal to approximately 300 people. The community support was overwhelming and instrumental in making this event a success. We are especially grateful to the Masonic Lodge for offering their facility, Paul Heiser & Stan Riley, Musicians, Sophia's, Nelli's, Family Video, Roscoe Pizza Ranch, INKSMART and the good coverage by the Beloit Daily News, WGEZ Radio, WCLO Radio and other media. Thank you to the volunteer group from the Lodge, the community and various churches. We were reminded of all that we can be thankful for as we served the community & ministered to "the least of these"... In this world they may be seen as least, but in God's eyes, the least, have great value to God. How great a value does a soul have to God..and we are blessed to be able to serve, as Jesus did. The servant is not greater than the master.

HOORAY and Glory to God! We are moving again! Our Worship Center, our Coffeehouse and our Frontline Youth Initiative activities will be relocated from 310 State Street to the former CARITAS building at 1175 Madison Road in Beloit. The new facility will double our capacity for activities and is in excellent condition.

Two anonymous donors gave a total of \$40,000 to make this transaction a reality. We pray that other friends and believers in this ministry would help to cover the difference of \$6,230. A special thank you to those who give regularly and to those giving In Memory of Loved Ones.

We will be celebrating our 40th Anniversary with an Open House and Concert including catered food, fellowship and music at our new location on Saturday May 3rd 2014. Doors will open at 4:00 pm. The concert will start at 7:00 pm with special guest musicians Glenn Kaiser and Rex Carroll. Opening for Glenn and Rex will be recording artist Sam Scales.


Thank you to the faithful ones who support us with their prayers and finances.

Every day we have opportunity to share the hope that is within us thru JESUS.

- We continue to refer people with addictions to treatment and rehabilitation programs.
- Every day we get phone calls from people needing assistance with gas to get to work or to a doctor's appointment or simply to look for work. We have given away thousands of dollars in financial assistance in the past two years alone. We always take the opportunity to tell them about Jesus and to pray with them. You can help us by purchasing \$15 gas cards or \$10 fast food vouchers and we will disburse them as needed.
- One example of someone we helped was a woman who was temporarily homeless. The police called and asked if we could stay open overnight. We agreed and the same night we received a call from the hospital who had a homeless woman with no place to go after treatment. Another volunteer and myself stayed overnight. We spent time with them, prayed with them and fed them. The next day one lady accepted Jesus as her personal Savior. Later we received a nice note in the mail which read "I just wanted to say "Thank You" for your kindness, understanding and forgiveness. I will NEVER forget the night you opened your doors for me when I had no place else to go and no one else I felt I could turn to. Please let me know if I can ever do anything to help you or your organization.... With sincere gratitude, ____ "

We continue to provide referrals and transportation to food pantries, housing appointments or other agencies in order to apply for services etc.
