# STRAIGHT THINKING about crooked ideas

Besides waiting on God, one of the hardest things to ascertain is God's will for our lives. However, I will never cease to be amazed at the number of people who don't seem to know where God is leading them but always know that the route their brother or sister in the Lord is traveling is the wrong one. Why is it when we see things happening in the Christian community that we don't understand or don't agree with, we look on these situations with skeptical eyes, knowing that Susie Spiritual or Victor Maturity isn't doing what God wants them to? Why is it when people don't turn up at the place we think they should be at the time we feel they should be there, that we know they have either back-slidden or couldn't possibly be listening to the Lord?

Who are we to doubt someone's commitment to the Lord just because their plans don't match up with ours? How do we know what they have to cope with behind the scenes or what burdens they have to carry that might keep them from living up to our expectations and specifications for what and where a "proper" Christian should be and when he should be there? Funny, isn't it? We can trust the Lord for a lot of things--healing, salvation, many spiritual gifts; but we can't trust Him for our fellow Christians' welfare when it appears to us that they are "getting way out into left field". One of the "gifts" we seem to have acquired is the gift of suspicion and we try to pass it off as discernment. But, I wonder how pleased God is by the way we always suspect each other of not being in God's will because we don't know or understand how God is leading.

When there are things you don't understand about what's happening in the lives of those around you, don't go to somebody else and ask them--"What's going on with so and so?" It isn't even necessary to go to the person in question and ask them. You can go to the Lord and tell Him you don't understand and ask Him to deal with the situation. One of the reasons you probably don't understand the situation could be that God hasn't designated you to be concerned about that particular problem. So, go to the Lord and tell Him that you are disturbed and ask Him what you should do about it. More often than not, He will probably tell you: "Be still and know that I am God." You can be sure that because God loves all of us so much, He is already mindful of things and has it all worked out ahead of time. Just because it bothers you don't automatically think that you've been appointed to deal with it or make it your concern. Just because you don't approve of something doesn't make it wrong.

Our self-righteous reactions to situations that are not our concern can stunt growth like using the wrong kind of weed killer can kill some good shrubs. If you seem to be upset by what you think is wrong with others more than seeing what is wrong in your own life, maybe it's time for a tune-up in your attitude. It is that time of year when we think of winterizing things--caulking windows to seal out the cold winter air, putting up storm windows and adding extra insulation here and there to save on the utility bills. This can also be applied to our spiritual houses. We need to caulk up the leaks in our attitudes that allow Satan to blow in through the cracks and cool us off. We need to put up some storm windows to protect us from Satan's attacks. If we add some extra insulation to those areas that are giving us problems, we can conserve the energy we use up by being worrisome, judgemental, critical etc..

How about it? Are you winterized? While you're at it, better check out your spiritual car. Is your anti-freeze the year around kind? Is it set for the proper temperature to prevent your radiator from freezing up? A few gallons of Holy Spirit anti-freeze is the best protection you can have.
