
I hope you have noticed that it has been almost a year since our last newsletter. You are probably thinking that nothing worth writing about has been happening around The Cup. Well, think again! 1985 will be added to the other years as one of learning - learning about being faithful and consistent in our walk with the Lor and in the ministry; learning about the importance of developing relationships and just holding on. Dave finished his time of employment in Chicago last March, which seemed like the longest year of our lives. Then he was without any work until September so we learned alot about hanging on when there wasn't much

to hang on to.

As for what's happening at The Cup, we have broadened our horizons considerably in the past few months. As you know, for eleven and a half years, we were purposely not open on Wednesday and Sunday so there would be no conflict with churches having services on those days. We have always wanted to be an arm of the church and still have no desire to compete with any church. However, we noticed that there are those that don't feel comfortable in a church setting because they don't have nice clothes or only the clothes on their backs as is sometimes the case with people who stay at our emergency shelter. So, on October 27, 1986, we began having Sunday Worship services at 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. and have had as many as 40 people in attendance. One Sunday we had 15 under the age of 14. As I said, our goal is not

to take anyone out of their church. if you already have a church, for goodness sake, stay in it unless the Lord tells you to do otherwise! We are here to catch those that "fall through the cracks", those that probably wouldn't be in church at all for one reason or another if they weren't here. We are not here as a place for disgruntled, dissatisfied church hoppers. We aren't trying to set any attendance records and we don't make announcements or take offerings, so we are probably a little different than some churches you may have attended. We are here to provided more opportunities for people to hear about Jesus, to help you find your place in the family of God if you haven't found it yet and to teach people how to live a victorious Christian life. We have dedicated two babies so far and have seen at least four fellas and a couple of gals make a brand new start on life.

HARBOR for the HOMELESS

How about this letterhead and logo design? It was designed by Paul Mitchell who is a member of The Harbor for the Homeless committee. It is meant to depict a modern-day Nativity. Kinda neat, isn't it? In case you aren't

yet familiar with the ministry of The Harbor, let me fill you in on some of the details. *THE HARBOR FOR THE HOMELESS came out of a Housing Task Force made up of concerned, community citizens who saw the need for a temporary, emergency shelter because of situations that were repeatedly being encountered. In November of 1984, the First United Methodist Church opened its doors to those who were in need of shelter and The Harbor for the Homeless was born. In April of 1985, The Harbor moved to The Overflowing Cup facility so that its ministry could be expanded somewhat. Our staff member, Vickie Chase, became the full-time Coordinator for The Harbor. Caritas, a coalition of at least 26 area churches, acted as a parent organization to help The Harbor get started. We are extremely grateful for their financial support and also for the food they give to help feed those who stay at The Harbor.

From January 1, 1985 through December 31, 1985, The Harbor provided 270 nights of shelter for 171 persons and served 910 meals. It has taken many volunteers to keep The Harbor open from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 a.m. seven days a week. Incidentally, we like to have two volunteers each night so if you believe this to be a worthwhile endeavor, would you be willing to be a volunteer some night? If every church in this area would provide volunteers for one night each month, it would really solve the problem of where to find enough people to keep it going. Think and pray about it. If you will help please call Vickie at 365-0365 and let her know of your availability. Of course, The Harbor can always use donations of food, especially milk, meat, eggs and fruit juice and we would never turn down fresh fruits and vegetables. We have had as many as 15 people around our table and that's alot of mouths to feed!!

Last fall, we were the beneficiaries of a fund raising project sponsored by the Good News Committee at raised a whopping \$1300 to help The Harbor and we are so appreciative of their help and interest. We recently received a grant from the State of Wisconsin designated specifically for shelters for the homeless. We are making good use of these funds and have started work on bathrooms with showers on the first floor and are in the process of hanging suspended ceiling to help with heating costs. We started making some improvements in our kitchen area and got the gas stove operative just in time to fix Thanksgiving turkey for 25 guests. It was really a blessing when we went shopping for a countertop and the first place we went to had a nice butcher block top leaning up against the wall with the hole for the sink already cut in just the right place and it fit our space perfectly almost like it was sitting there just waiting for us to pick it up! It is a blessing for us to share these special blessings

with you because as we recount them, we realize we aren't just spinning our wheels but are making some progress even if it seems to be at a snail's pace sometimes.

This part of the ministry is very demanding and will require much help and support to continue. If you would like to learn more about it and how you can help, if you would like to know what a volunteer does, or if you can help in any way, please let us know. WE NEED YOU!!!!

Most of you probably know by now that we moved our Bookstore to Northgate Plaza last March. Prior to that, it was always a part of our Coffee House facility since our original purpose for having a store was to make the materials so important for spiritual growth available to our new Christians and for those who come to The Cup for Coffee House activities as well as the general public. It was always our desire and hope that the store would eventually help to support the ministry and/or provide an income for someone who felt called to that special ministry. The decision to move the store was a tough one and was made because it was almost a "do or die" situation, partly because we hadn't had funds to advertise it properly, partly because our storefront didn't exactly excite or invite shoppers and also because Downtown Beloit isn't the ideal place for a retail business such as ours. We felt that we should either have a store that was an honor unto the Lord or not have one at all. So that lead us to make the move to Northgate Plaza.

When we first re-located, we were in a 2,000 sq. ft. area which made for a very nice store with lots of space. However, space in a shopping center is at a premium and no one can afford it if it doesn't turn around enough dollars. Even though our new image, the higher volume of traffic and the exposure was good for us, we hadn't ever had to pay rent before so the first of the month seemed to roll around pretty fast. Shortly after we moved, my step-father became seriously ill and that made it increasingly difficult for me to be at the store tending to business when I needed to be with my Mom. Since the store was struggling to recover from two moves within a six-month period, it wasn't able to pay anyone to be there and it isn't easy to find that special person to learn the "ins and outs" of Christian Bookselling who wants to put in the necessary time on a volunteer basis. So, we offered the store for sale and had some good positive responses. We were reasonably certain the store was sold, so when the time came to renew my lease option, I gave up my location which was promptly rented by another retailer. To make a long story shorter, my buyer's financing fell through and I still had a store but I didn't have any place to put it. The only other available location at Northgate was a 1,000 sq. ft. area and even though I had my doubts as to whether or not I could make it fit, we took it so that we didn't have to change the address of the store again. Believe it or not, it has really worked out well as you know if you have been there and the rent was only half as much as it was before! We had just increased our profitability a whole bunch and at the same time confirmed what we knew all along - that the Lord is really the best business manager anyone could have!

Now we find ourselves with a growing store, with so much potential it has become more than we have time for because of all the other things we've got going. Therefore, we are once again offering the store FOR SALE in hopes that someone with a heart and calling for this ministry, someone who can spot potential and is willing to develop it, will end up getting the desires of his heart.
